Catch-Up Premium Report



2022-2023

'State-funded schools will receive NTP funding over the course of the 2022 to 2023 academic year to deliver tuition to their pupils. This funding is paid in termly instalments via local authorities and academy trusts. It is intended to cover 60% of the unit cost of tuition, with schools targeting the tutoring offer towards their pupil premium (PP) cohort and making up the remainder of the cost using PP or from other core school budgets.'

There are 3 routes to providing subsidised tuition; we have chosen:



This funding will further support our whole school priority, <i>Challenge for All</i> which aims to ensure all of our children are challenged appropriately so they are able to make optimal progress throughout the year.</p> <p data-bbox="203 759 1084 791">Our strategy at West Hampstead is to support the children through:</p> <ul data-bbox="255 810 1576 890" style="list-style-type: none">• 1:1 tuition delivered during school hours by an additional ‘catch-up’ teacher• 1:1 and small group tuition delivered by a range of classroom practitioners outside of school hours <p data-bbox="203 948 1957 1056">With the additional funding for the year 2022-23, we will continue to provide extra support for those children who are not yet reaching national expectation in their year group, paying extra attention to those who are pupil premium. Data collected in Summer 2022 and Autumn 2022 indicates that Key Stage 2 should remain a priority for catch up funding.</p> <p data-bbox="203 1066 412 1098">This is because:</p> <ul data-bbox="255 1107 1406 1177" style="list-style-type: none">• there are larger gaps in attainment between pupil premium and non-pupil premium;• attainment in years 4 and 5 is a concern.
