- I can ask and answer simple questions about the past.

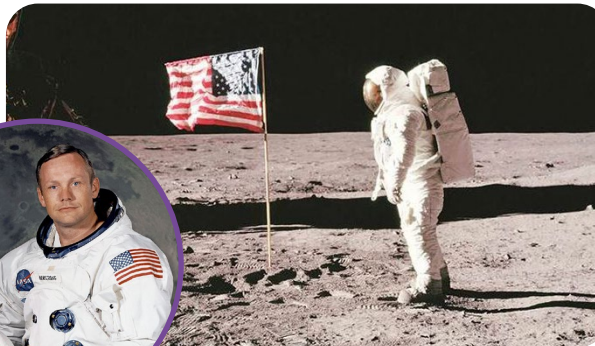


How can we compare these significant explorers?
