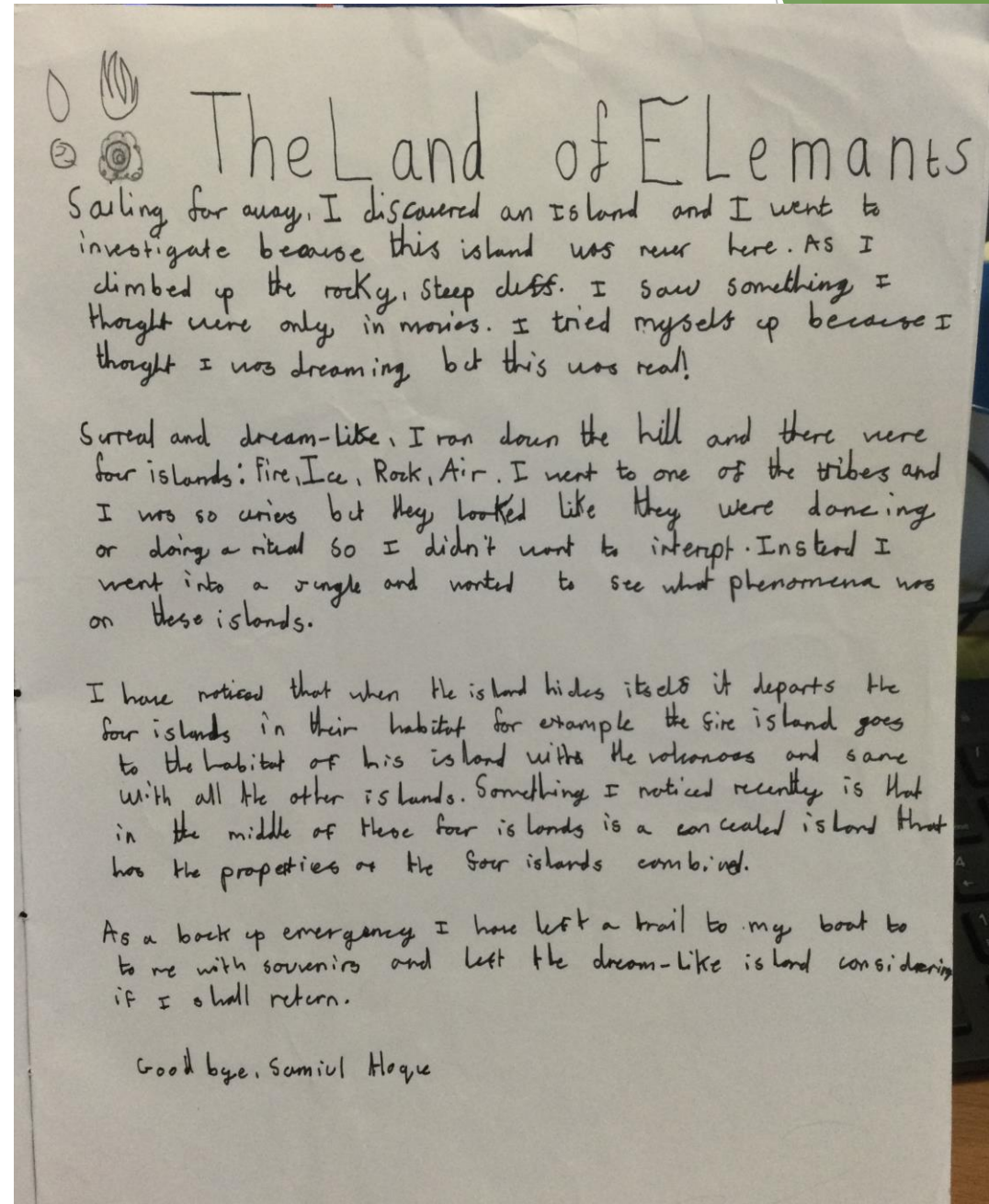

We know so much about him by his book and the different information passed down by people.


How was Darwin resilient? How could you apply the same to your own life?
