Year 3/4 Camden inter-School Benchball





Camden Target Sports













In November our 'Change for life' sports club attended Camden target sports event at Talacre Sports centre. The children had a great day in a friendly environment where they played lots of different target based games. It was great to see them all come back smiling and happy. The 'change for life' club takes place every Tuesday lunchtime from 12.30-1pm for a select group of pupils from years 4-6. The aim is to give the children an extra opportunity to be active and get fit in a very inclusive and supportive environment.







Intra class sports competitions

The intra-class competitions have continued this half term with some great team work from each class to get all players involved and representing their class. Each class starts with 200 points at the start of week one but loses 10 points per player who fails to compete across the two weeks of competition. They also gain 30 points for 1st, 20 points for 2nd and 10 points for 3rd place in each week of competition. As an added bonus, points are also awarded for teams who show great respect and honesty whilst playing. Unsportsman/woman like behaviour can lead to teams losing 10 points for each offence so children need to remember the importance of playing by the rules and being respectful to other players.
